† PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE †

Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend's news informed us that President Obama has declared the H1N1 flu outbreak a national emergency. Diocesan officials have not yet made any general regulations regarding parish procedures but have encouraged each parish and/or community to make decisions based on their particular situation. The diocese, as well as all health officials, remind us that we must practice good hygiene and cough and sneeze etiquette. If you are ill, if you are running a temperature, you are excused from Sunday Mass. Stay home and get well! We have placed bottles of hand sanitizer around the Church and we encourage you to make frequent use of this. The extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion wash their hands in the sacristy before Mass and use sanitizer before coming into the sanctuary to begin their ministry. We are also frequently disinfecting the door handles to the Church. One physician in the parish has suggested that we do not shake hands in greeting one another, nor at the sign of peace and that we not hold hands during the Our Father. While not making this a parish policy at this time, some may want to follow this advice and are welcome to do so. Therefore, if those around you refuse to take your hand, please do not think them unkind or unfriendly. At this time we will not discontinue Holy Communion from the chalice nor require everyone to receive Communion in the hand, but we may come to that. Again, if you are ill, please stay home. If you come to Mass and have a cold or do not feel well, do not receive the Precious Blood.

I suspect that most of you did not know Ray Cassidy, one of our parishioners who died a couple of weeks ago. In my time as pastor here, he was involved in the life of the parish, and was regular in his attendance at Mass and the reception of the sacraments. Several years ago, Ray came to me and told me that he wanted the parish to be the beneficiary of his estate upon his death. He was true to his word. He named St. Stephen Cathedral as the beneficiary of a life insurance policy as well as the entity to inherit all his other property. The fact that neither the insurance policy, nor his house were of a great amount, is not important. What is noteworthy is that Ray's Catholic faith and his love for you, his parish family, prompted him to do this. Of course, the fact that he had no immediate family made this gesture easier. As I have done in the past, I invite you to ask yourself how your will reflects your faith and your appreciation for your parish. In the meantime, offer a prayer of thanksgiving for Ray Cassidy and commend him to the mercy of God.

Last week, I received the tragic news that a seminary classmate of mine had been murdered in his rectory in Patterson, NJ. Fr. Ed Hines and I spent four years together in Rome and we were both ordained in the summer of 1974. We also studied canon law at the same time in 1984. Please offer a prayer for Fr. Ed, for his family and his parish community which is undoubtedly devastated by this violence. We should also pray for the parish employee who has been charged with the crime. He must be a very troubled man.

Fr. Joshua and I had a good retreat last week at Mount St. Joseph. Thank you for your prayers and we assure you that you were remembered daily in our Mass and prayer.

EUCCHARISTIC MEDITATION

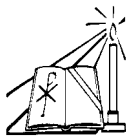

This Week's Stewardship Moment

The passive tone of the translation of the *Beatitudes* in the *Sermon on the Mount* in St. Matthew's Gospel must be read in concert with the *mandate to act* in St. Luke's version of the same event (Luke 6:20-38).

Rev. Abuna Elias Chacour, a Melkite Catholic priest, speaks Aramaic, the language that Jesus spoke, and he translates the *Beatitudes* in a more proactive way. Instead of the familiar "Blessed ..." he begins with the phrase "Get up, go ahead, do something, move, you who are hungry and thirsty for justice, for you shall be satisfied; Get up, go ahead, do something, move, you peacemakers, for you shall be called children of God..."

Jesus was challenging the people listening to him, and he is saying to us, *Get up, go ahead, do something, move!*
Are we?

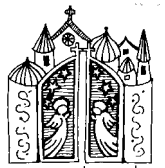

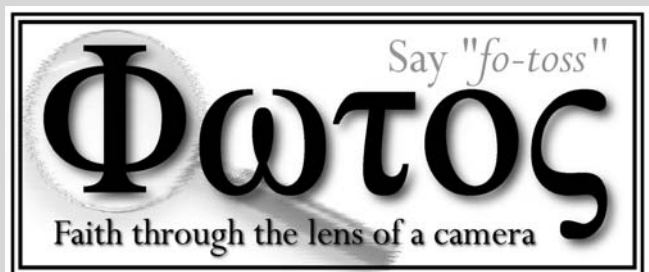
SERVANT BISHOP
