† PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE †

Dear Parishioners,

Many thanks to those who have submitted nominations for the Parish Pastoral Council. We are in the process of contacting those nominated, to invite them to an orientation meeting prior to their decision whether or not to accept the nomination to the Council. The Council will meet this Thursday and begin its examination of the information gathered at our Best Practices gatherings. Thanks again to all of you who are participating in this effort.

As you know, this month of November is dedicated to the Souls in Purgatory. Many of you have listed, in our Book of Remembrance, the names of deceased loved ones that you want prayed for at all our Masses throughout the month. This would be a good opportunity for you to re-familiarize yourself with the Church's teaching on Purgatory. An excellent resource for such a read is the *United States Catholic Catechism for Adults* or the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. If you do not have a copy of either of these resources, you should have. You can find them at either of our local Catholic bookstores or perhaps even in Books a Million.

You have probably seen news articles reporting that Pope Benedict is establishing a new Church structure for Anglicans (Episcopalians) who desire to enter into full unity with the Catholic Church. This has generated much conversation and some controversy. Some have judged that, with this move, the Catholic Church is trying to "steal sheep" from another Church. However, in the words of Cardinal Kaspar, the Holy Father is "not fishing in the Anglican pond." Rather, this new structure is in response to many who have sought admission into the Catholic Church and who desire to maintain some of their Anglican spiritual traditions. The overture is not extended to individuals as much as it is to entire groups or churches who wish to become Catholic. Actually, there is great precedence for this. As you may know, there are twenty-two different churches (formally called "Rites") that compose the one, holy, Catholic and apostolic Church. Our Church, the Latin Church, is the largest body and all the others originate in places like India, Greece etc. They all accept Catholic doctrine, are in communion with the Holy Father and yet maintain their own styles, traditions, law and liturgical forms.

Last week, you received a letter from me regarding our annual stewardship commitment. You will hear from our Stewardship Committee this week. I have nothing to add to that information except to ask you to give it your attention and prayerful consideration. To be a member of the Church, to belong to a parish, is to assume responsibility – to be committed. Each of us must ask ourselves how best to express our faith through our pledge to be an active member of St. Stephen Cathedral. God bless you!

**SOLDIER AND SAINT**

“While many miracles are attributed to him, St Martin is known most of all for an act of fraternal charity. While still a young soldier, he met a poor man on the street numb and trembling from the cold. He then took his own cloak and, cutting it in two with his sword, gave half to that man. Jesus appeared to him that night in a dream smiling, dressed in the same cloak.

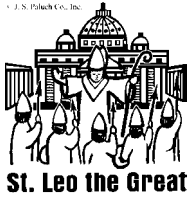

**A GREAT PONTIFF**

“The fame of one particular episode in Leo’s life has endured. It dates back to 452 when the Pope, together with a Roman delegation, met Attila, chief of the Huns, in Mantua and dissuaded him from continuing the war of invasion by which he had already devastated the northeastern regions of Italy. Thus, he saved the rest of the Peninsula. This important event soon became memorable and lives on as an emblematic sign of the Pontiff’s action for peace.

“Unfortunately, the outcome of another Papal initiative three years later was not as successful, yet it was a sign of courage that still amazes us: in the spring of 455 Leo did not manage to prevent Genseric’s Vandals, who had reached the gates of Rome, from invading the undefended city that they plundered for two weeks. This gesture of the Pope - who, defenseless and surrounded by his clergy, went forth to meet the invader to implore him to desist - nevertheless prevented Rome from being burned and assured that the Basilicas of St Peter, St Paul and St John, in which part of the terrified population sought refuge, were spared.”

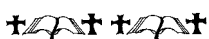

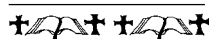
