Dear Parishioners,

We made it! By the time you read this, we will have a new bishop. As we continue to thank God for the twenty-seven years of Bishop McRaith's Episcopal ministry, now we are equally grateful that God has sent us a new shepherd in the person of Bishop William Medley. I hope that many of you were able to attend his ordination on Wednesday. As I write this on Tuesday, snow is coming down relentlessly. I trust that you enjoyed the special edition of ***The Western Kentucky Catholic*** that you received last week. Note the beautiful welcoming ad from St. Stephen Cathedral. The picture is of the Holy Spirit window that will be revealed when we remove the mosaic and install the beautiful reredos.

A special word of thanks to all who so swiftly and joyfully responded to our plea for help with removing the snow in preparation for the Bishop's big day. You are great!

Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. As I mentioned last week, we will have a Lenten mission beginning on February 28th, conducted by Fr. Dan Dorsey, the president of the Glenmary Home Missioners. The Mission will focus on the passion and death of Jesus and its consequences for us. On Sunday evening, the topic will be "Who Killed Jesus?" Monday's theme is: "Why is Suffering a Necessary Part of Jesus' Passion and Death?" On Tuesday, Fr. Dan will focus on the Holy Eucharist and its relationship to the death and resurrection of Jesus. On Wednesday, the final night of the Mission, Father's topic will be "What meaning does the Passion and Death of the Christ have in my Life?" As you can see, the sermons will take us into the heart of Lent and help us to prepare for Holy Week. During the week, there will also be opportunity to meet with Fr. Dan individually and for confession.

This afternoon is the annual Gospel Explosion at Blessed Sacrament Chapel. This is a time of ecumenical song and prayer hosted by our sisters and brothers at Blessed Sacrament. I invite you to join us at 2:30PM.

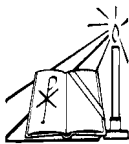
forgiveness and His friendship.

Thanks to Christ’s action, we may enter into the ‘greatest’ justice, which is that of love (cf. Rm 13, 8-10), the justice that recognizes itself in every case more a debtor than a creditor, because it has received more than could ever have been expected. Strengthened by this very experience, the Christian is moved to contribute to creating just societies, where all receive what is necessary to live according to the dignity proper to the human person and where justice is enlivened by love.”

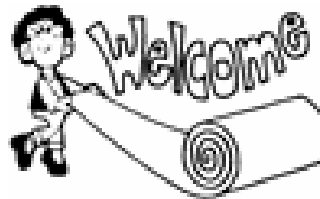

LENTEN GUIDELINES

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving and prayer the Church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday; this threefold discipline is particularly legislated on Good Friday and

is encouraged for Holy Saturday. All of the faithful and the catechumens should undertake serious practice of these three traditions. "Penance should be not only internal and individual, but also external and social" (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*, #5).

Abstinence from meats is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on **Ash Wednesday** and on all **Fridays of Lent**, including **Good Friday**.

Fasting is to be observed on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday** by all Catholics who are 18-59 years of age. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal and two smaller meals unless dispensed or excused. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted, unless dispensed.

The special **Paschal fast and abstinence** are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

Those unable to fast and abstain are urged to practice other forms of self-denial, suitable to their condition.

Almsgiving opportunities are in the Special Collections listed elsewhere in the bulletin.

WORD OF LIFE

Chastity is the joyous affirmation of someone who knows how to live self-giving, free from any form of self-centered slavery.



This presupposes that the person has learnt how to accept other people, to relate with them, while respecting their dignity in diversity. The chaste person is not self-centered, not involved in selfish relationships with other people. Chastity makes the personality harmonious.

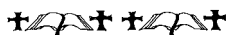

ELEMENTARY GIRLS VOLLEYBALL SIGNUPS

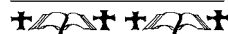
